## **COACHES REPORT 2007**

This year we have experienced a continued growth in all aspects of the clubs development, some which quite honestly make you proud to be part of it. The outcome of the various landmark achievements such as Gym Mark accreditation, Jack Petchey Gold recognition, Club SX, plus others, provides the springboard that allows members of all levels within the club to benefit to some degree. The outcome of this is a club which has all the credentials for future success. I personally would, amongst others, like to thank Dave Kingaby, whose skills have guided us towards these achievements.
